



Encouraging voluntary involvement and community participation

Who we are and what we do


- Books4Babies Ireland Limited is a voluntary charitable organisation set up in 2012
- We give a pack containing two books and material about the importance of reading free to all babies born in Co. Wexford - BookStart programme
- We also encourage parents and children to use the library and our packs are distributed by Public Health Nurses during the child's 7-9 month developmental check





- Wexford is the 4th
 most disadvantaged
 County in Ireland
- 150,000 people with circa 2,000 births a year.
- In Gorey (where B4B was piloted) 650 live births that year

Babies Love Books (2000-2002)



- 1. Centralised
- 2. No community involvement
- 3. No single organisation responsible

Getting Started

- We got together a small group of local people (health, education and childcare) to run a pilot program in Gorey
- Literacy Acquisition is a Community Issue
- We raised seed funding from the local community to start the project, setting a target of raising 50% of the initial funding before approaching the local statutory agencies for support.


Challenges of expanding the programme

Voluntary community participation in B4B - that we learned

- It is possible, using voluntary effort to start and maintain a book gifting scheme – on a small scale.
 But as the programme grew we had (unfortunately) to scale back on our use of TY student because of the effort required.
- Community involvement helped ensure involvement of local statutory agencies.
- People are receptive to the idea that literacy acquisition is a community issue and they are willing to engage programmes such as B4B to effect change.
