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Bookstart Around the World

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This knowledge overview highlights that bookgifting programs are effective, efficient and have a positive effect on children's language development:


 Bookgifting programs alter caregivers' and children's attitudes towards reading

 The more written language stimulus, the better the conditions for language development

 Reading aloud at home at an early age (2-3 years) affects school results (8-9 years), as children's language development and other cognitive development go further

Bookgifting programs can especially support groups with poorer socio-economic conditions



"The findings corroborate the assumption that book giveaways promote family book reading routines, which consequently results in children scoring higher on measures of children's literacyrelated behaviour and skills. The findings thus support the theory that the early initiation of book reading promoted by book give away programs generates a "snowball effect".
